- 4. CHANCELLOR'S LIAISON REPORT
  - x Blue Ribbon Commission
    - o MarylandReporter.com article regarding new Biem Fund Commission: report due by June 2011 with recommendations implemented by 2013
    - o Blue Ribbon Commission is looking at responsibility/promise of State to retirees, which is about \$20 billion and growing
    - Pension Fund Commission (Public Employees atine ReBenefit Sustainability Commission) is looking into State retiree benefits and pension; first meeting is Oct. 7 in Annapolis
    - o Health-care reform will also impact everything
    - o Commissions will be looking at cutting back
  - x Board of Regents approved tuition remission benefit for same spouses (not domestic partners); retroactive to July 1, 2010
    - o Pending to be addressed:
      - sick leave policy (bereavement)
      - FMLA: policy based on federal law and federal government hasn't accepted samesex spouses
      - Nepotism
  - x RosarioVan Daalen reminded the council that Board of Regents policy allows State employees to serve as election judges
